Robert Lynch, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles G. Lynch, has been accepted at Geneseo State College for enrollment in September.

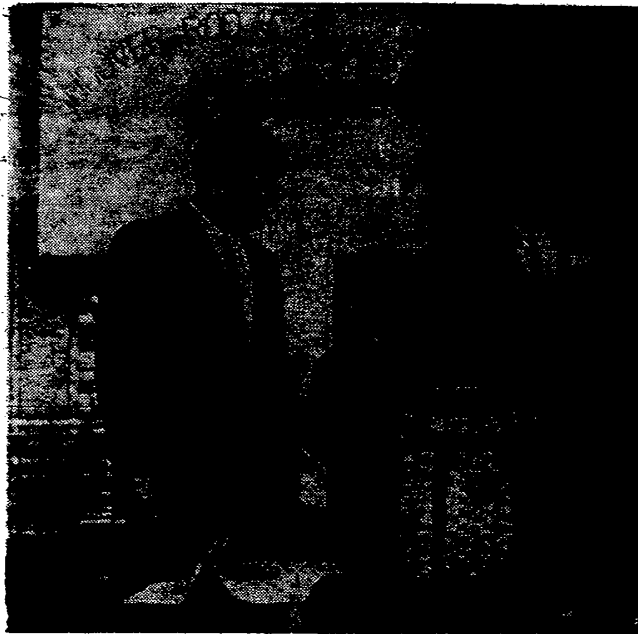

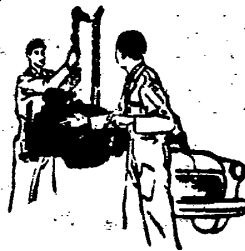
