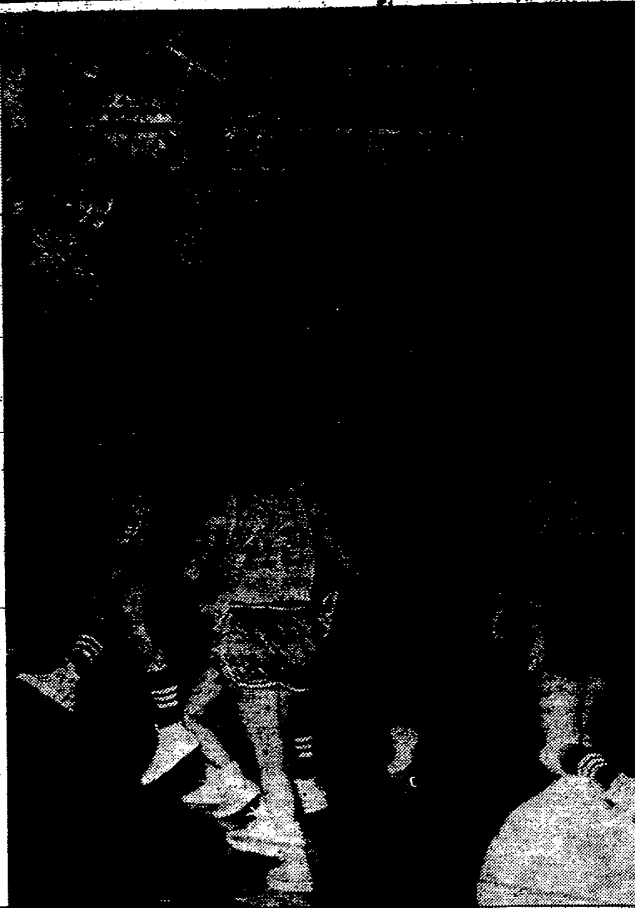

Addison To Have New Sewer System

New York State Pure Water Authority Chairman, George A. Dudley, has signed a \$1,610,249 contract with the Village of Addison, under which the Authority will assist the Village in the construction, operation and maintenance of a sewage treatment plant and sewage collection system. The Steuben County community will receive Federal and State construction grants totaling \$412,230 toward the pollution control project.

The Pure Water Authority is also helping the Village in arranging financing for these facilities over an expected period of 40 years.

Has Vehicle Registration Expires

Motor Vehicle Commissioner Vincent L. Toppo today recommended that New York motorists check their registration expiration dates. "About 10 million vehicles will be expiring on January 31, 1969, and some owners may have forgotten that there is among them," he said. "Particularly if for some reason or other they have not been able to renew their registration."

Presently, residential and commercial wastes and waste waters from the Village are being dumped, untreated, into the waters of the Canisteo River.

In June 1967, the New York State Health Department ordered Addison to program the necessary facilities to correct and treat their sewage, and thus halt pollution of the Canisteo, which is in violation of the State water quality standards.

The sewage collection system and treatment facilities for Addison are being designed by the engineering firm of Ward & Moore, of Corning.
