 A. The same as E Rands. Interest is subject to Federal income tax, which may be deferred until maturity or redemption (whichever comes first). Interest is not subject to state or local mome taxes. Current values are subject to estate, inheritance, gift, and other excise taxes, both Federal and state.
- Q. Will Freedom Shares be extended beyond maturity, as E Bonds have been? A. No. Under existing law, there is no provision for extension.
