Village Board Selects Wellsville Landfill Site

At the regular Village Board Meeting held Tuesday evening, the most important decision made was the selection for the disposal of refuse and garbage for the Village made necessary by the closing of the Andover Dump by the State Health Department.

Donald MacFarquar, Supt. of Public Works, Wellsville, attended the meeting and explained in detail the operation and proposed cost of the shared landfill operation. After his explanations, Village Board Members were given the opportunity to question him on any and all phases of the operation.

After reaching the decision to use the Wellsville site, a statement to the press was issued that: "The Village Board of Andover feels that the only way that we will be able to solve the common problem faced by so many villages over garbage disposal is by working together with Wellsville than separately. It is felt that this joint action can be successful and beneficial to both Andover and Wellsville if we work with a spirit of cooperation and mutual trust."

It is also felt that the cost is very comparable to other landfill operations and that it is easily accessible all year round with good roads. Also taken into consideration was the fact that it will be open to the public from 8 a. m. until 5 p. m. for 6 days a week except Sundays.

It must also be remembered that the Village of Wellsville has come to the assistance of the Andover Electric Department and Streets Department whenever they have been called on which clearly shows that they have shown a spirit of cooperation in the past.

Reports of the heads of Village Departments were also submitted at the meeting and regular bills audited and ordered paid.
