Village Board Selects Wellsville Landfill Site

At the regular Village Board Meeting held Tuesday evening, thermost important decision made was the selection for the disposal of refuse and garbage for the Village made necessary by the closing of the Andewer Dump by the State Health Department.

Donald MacFarquar, Sunt. of Public Works, Wellsville, attended the meeting and explained in de-

rubne works, we sville, attended the meeting-and explained in detail the operation and proposed cost of the shared landfill operation. After his explanations, Village Board Members were given the opportunity to question him on any and all phases of the operation.

After reaching the decision to use the Wellsville site, a statement to the press was issued that:

"The Village Board of Andover feels that the only way that we will be able to solve the common problem faced by so many villages over garbyge disposal is by working together with Wellsville than separately. It is felt that this joint action can be successful and beneficial to both Andover and Wellsville if we work with a spirit of cooperation and mutual trust. of cooperation and mutual trust.
