Ae we are ready to go to press we have just been informed that a large break in the main 6 inch water supply line from the springs has made it necessary for Village Officials to ask that all residents cut down their use of water to a bare minimum until the break can be remarked.

The rupfured water main appears to be located on the South bank of Route 17 where it comes down off the hill opposite the Harry Joyce residence.

Frank Cahill, Supt. of the Water Department stated that the pump for the deep well had been started at the reservoir site as soon as the break was discovered, but unless at the reservoir site as soon as the break was discovered, but unless Andover residents co-opera'e a. cut down their use of Village water, a serious water shortage could develop. His crew is working at the site of the break with members of the Andover Fire Department furnishing emergency lighting for the project with other members standing by at the Fire Hall in case of a fire call. Also, Ken Vars, Andover Fire Chief informs us that the Fire Department tanker is full and ready to move out and that the Allegany County Fire Control has been alerted to the water shortage situation and the water shortage situation and that other tankers in the County are on a stand-by back-up alert in case they should be needed.
