Tax Rules On Dependent Children

A \$600 exemption may be taken a baby born anytime during year as long as certain tests met, John E. Foley, District ector, Internal Revenue Ser-

One or the basic requirements for claiming a child as a dependent is that the taxpayer provide more than half the child's support for the entire year. If a child is born, or dies, during the year, this support test has to be met for the months the child was alive.

Another test for dependency is

Another test for dependency is that the child must either be related to the taxpayer or be a member of the taxpayer's household.

The child must also be a citizen or resident of the United States to

be claimed as a dependent. The exceptions to this rule are for a child who is a resident of Canada, Mexico, Panama or the Canal

Mr. Foley said the requirement that a person cannot have income of \$600 or more a year and be claimed as a dependent by another taxpayer does not apply to a child whe is either under 19 at the end of the year or a full-time student for some part of five months of the year.

When the child is under 19 or is a full-time student his exemption could be claimed on different tax returns. The child would claim his own exemption on the return he was required to file and his parents would still be entitled to claim his exemption on their return.

The child is considered a full-time student if he is enrolled at an educational institution that has a regular faculty and curriculum and has a heady of students. Mr. Foley said the requirement

in attendance. Also, a child is considered a student if he is in a full-time, on-farm training course that is under the approvision of an agent of a state or one of its political subdivisions. in attendance.

Tax Laws Require Good Records on Business Travel, Enetertainment

If you plan to list a business deduction for travel and entertainment expenses be sure to have the records to substantiate these expenses, John E. Foley, District Director, Internal Revenue Service Buffalo, announces. Estimates of

these expenses are not legally acceptable for tag purposes.

Mr. Foley said in many instances, a taxpayer should keep a diary or timely record as well as receipts and invoices to back up a travel or entertainment expense. travel or entertainment expense.

To substantiate entertainment expense.

To substantiate entertainment expenses you hust establish the amount of each separate expenditure except. For miscellaneous items like this, phone calls, tips and meals while traveling away from home, which can be added together for each day. In addition, the date of the expenditure must be confirmed, the name of the person entertained indicated and the type and location of the entertype and location of the enter-tainment described.

Mr. Foley said the taxpayer's records should also show the rearecords should also show the rea-son for the entertainment or the business benefit expected, the na-ture of the business discussion and the names, titles and business rel-ationship of the persons enter-
