## Health Insurance For The Uninsurables

"Those persons in this State unable to obtain health and hospital insurance due to health defects are the very people that need it most! The bill that I have introduced will make this insurance available to them by the cstablishment of a joint underwriter pool'

According to the proposed law introduced this week in the Senate, all insurance companies in the State which write health and hos-pital policies, would belong to a state organization of joint under-

writers formed to provide this coverage in an economical, fair and non-discriminatory manner.

ron-discriminatory manner.

Functioning not dissimilarly to the automobile driver pool and the new law providing fire insurance for those "uninsurables" considered high risks by regular underwriting companies in those fields, the assigned risk pool would be established amending the insurance laws of the State. Coverage would be available to a great number of persons who can afford health insurance but are unable to presently secure it.

The joint underwriting associ-

The joint underwriting association, under provisions of this bill, would submit a proposed plan to the Superintendent of Insurance to protect disabled and semi-disabled persons who are unable to obtain such insurance through normal insurance channels by reason of age and health impellments including mental disorders. including mental disorders

The plan would include preliminary assessment of all members for initial expenses, the establish-nt of necessary facilities, man-agement of the association, ass-essment of members to defray

losses and expenses, commission arrangements and procedures for determining amounts of insurance to be provided. The plan would only take effect 10 days after approval by the superintendent of insurance.

Each insurer in the health and Each insurer in the health and hospital fields would be mandated to belong to the organization as a condition of its authority to continue to transact these kinds of insurance in New York Stae.
