4.3 Miles Of Route 408 Open For Bids

Governor Rockefeller has announced that the State Department of Transportation will open bids on April 10 for 16 highway projects with an estimated total cost of \$5,199,000.

The State's share of the proposed contracts will be paid with funds from the Transportation Bond Issue approved by New York voters in 1967.

Work will involve improvements in 13 counties. The largest project is for resurfacing of 3.16 miles of Route 16 in the Towns of Olean and Hinsdale, Cattaraugus County, for an estimated \$1,000,000.

Widening and resurfacing of Route 98 for 0.57-mile and resurfacing for an adjacent 5.5 miles in the Towns of Gains and Carlton, Orleans County, is estimated at \$687,000.

Resurfacing of 4.3 miles of Route 408 in the Towns of Birdsall and Grove, Allegany County, \$255,000.
