Individual and team plaques honoring a former Andover resident were presented Tuesday to wrestlers competing in the Section 5 tournament in Geneva.

Mr. and Mrs. Richard Ordway of 18 1/2 Main St., Andover, parents of the late John Ordway, and his widow, the former Mary Deery of Wellsville, were guests at the tournament and presented the plaques.

Mr. Ordway presented the traveling team trophy to the championship team in his son's name. The plaque goes to the Sectional champion each year. Mrs. Ordway presented in her late husband's name an individual plaque awarded to the outstanding wrestler in the tournament.

John Ordway was born in Andover and lived in Wellsville for a number of years, graduating from high school in Wellsville in 1952. He attended Mansfield, Pa., State Teachers College and taught school in Dansville for three years before moving to Pittsford, a suburb of Rochester. He served as varsity wrestling coach at Pittsford High School until his death from leukemia in 1968 at age 34.
