

Legal Notice

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT LOCAL LAW MO. 1 of 1969 was filed in the Office of the Secretary of State on March 10, 1969, and became effective in accordance with its provisions. The taxt of the law is as follows:

A local law providing for a permaneat plan of apportionment for the Allegany County Board of Legislators on a district basis. Be it enacted by the Board of Subervisors of the County of Allegany as follows:

SECTION 1.

Legiclative Intent The intent of this Local Law is to reapportion the Board of Supervisors of Allegany County in accordance with the so-called "ene-man, one-vote" rule of constitutional law.

SECTION 2. The County Board of Legis-

The Board of Legislators shall be the elective governing body of the County and shall take the place of the Board of Supervisors. The elected legislators shall; when law-fully convened, constitute the legislative, appropriating, governing and pelicy determining body. of Allegacy County with all the powers and duties of a Board of Supervisors as provided by applicable law. pervisors able law. SECTION 3.

Election and Term of Office of Legislators

County Legislators shall be elec-ted at the general election held in every other odd numbered year in every other odd numbered year in such memore and in such numbers as hereinafter provided, the first such election to be held at the time of the general election in Normalist, 1969. The term of office of all County Lagislators shall be four years duting from January first of the year next succeeding their election. SECTION 4.

Districts and Numbers of County Logislators

For the purpose of electing County Legislators in such numbers as hereinafter provided, Allegany County shall be divided into five districts.

The districts and number of County Legislators shall be as follows:

1. District 1 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Towns of Centerville, Hume, Granger, Grove, Rushford, Caneadea, Allen, Birdsall, Belfast and Angelica, and shall have three County Legislators.

District 2 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Towns of New Hudson, Guba, Friendship, Clarksville and Genesee and shall have three County Legalitors.

District 3 stall consist District 3 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Towns of Wirt, Spio, Belivar, Alms, Willing and Indepen-dence and shall have three County Legislators. District 4 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Town-of Wellsville and shall have

SECTION 6. Primary Lineting for Laplain

Candidates to the office of Courty Legislator shall be nominated at the annual primary election held in the odd numbered year before the expiration of the term of office sought, commencing with the primary election to be held in the year 1969.

SECTION 7.

A vacancy in the office of County Legislator shall be filled by the appointment, by a majority vote of the County Board of Legislators, of a person who possesses all of the qualifications required of members of the County Board of Legislators as set forth in Section members of the County Board of Legislators as set forth in Section 5 of this Local Law. The person appointed shall hold office, by virtue of such appointment, until the commencement of the political year next succeeding the first annual election at which the vacancy can be filled by election for the remainder of the unexpired term, if any.

SECTION 8.

Meetings with Town Super-

visors

The County Legislators from each of the aforesaid five districts shall meet with the Town Supervisor or Town Supervisors of the town or towns within their respecown or towns within their respec-tive District at least once every three months during each calendar year, at such time and place as they shall mutually agree mon they shall mutually agree upon, for the purpose of providing liaison between County and Town governments and for such other purposes as said County and Town

officers may deem appropriate.

It is not intended by this Section to delegate or confer any legislative or administrative powers or duties which are or may be delegated or conferred by law on ers or duties when see or hery or-delegated or conferred by law on-the County Board of Legislators. Any decision, recommendation or resolution by such County and Town officers shall have no legal force or effect on the County Board of Legislators or the County of Allegany.

SECTION 9. Effect of Other Laws or Acts Any law, general, special or local, or any ordinance, resolution or other act to the extent inconsistent herewith shall be superseded by the within law.

SECTION 10. Separability

Separability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Local Law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such adjudication shall not affect, impair or invalidate the valid, such adjudication shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, settence, paragraph or faction thereof directly involved in the proceeding in which such adjudication shall have been rendered.

March 4, 1989 and, if approved by
