Legal Notice

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT LOCAL LAW NO. 1 of 1969 was filed in the Office of the Secretary of State on March 10, 1969, and became effective in accordance with its provisions. The text of the law is as follows:

A local law providing for a permanent plan of apportionment for the Allegany County Board of Legislators on a district basis.

Be it enacted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Allegany as follows:

SECTION 1.

Legislative Intent

The intent of this Local Law is to reapportion the Board of Supervisors of Allegany County in accordance with the so-called "one-man, one-vote" rule of constitutional law.

SECTION 2.

The County Board of Legislators

The Board of Legislators shall be the elective governing body of the County and shall take the place of the Board of Supervisors. The elected legislators shall, when lawfully convened, constitute the legislative, appropriating, governing and policy determining body of Allegany County with all the powers and duties of a Board of Supervisors as provided by applicable law.

SECTION 3.

Election and Term of Office of Legislators

County Legislators shall be elected at the general election held in every other odd numbered year in such manner and in such numbers as hereinafter provided, the first such election to be held at the time of the general election in November, 1969. The term of office of all County Legislators shall be four years ending from January first of the year next succeeding their election.

SECTION 4.

Districts and Numbers of County Legislators

For the purpose of electing County Legislators in such numbers as hereinafter provided, Allegany County shall be divided into five districts.

The districts and number of County Legislators shall be as follows:

- 1. District 1 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Towns of Centerville, Hume, Granger, Grove, Rushford, Caneadea, Allen, Birdsall, Belfast and Angelica, and shall have three County Legislators.
2. District 2 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Towns of New Hudson, Cuba, Friendship, Clarksville and Genesee and shall have three County Legislators.
3. District 3 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Towns of Wirt, Spio, Belvar, Alms, Willing and Independence and shall have three County Legislators.
4. District 4 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Town of Wellsville and shall have three County Legislators.
5. District 5 shall consist of the area contained within the boundaries of the Towns of Burns, Almond, West Almond, Amity, Ward, Alfred and Andover and shall have three County Legislators.

Each County Legislator shall be elected by his respective district at large.

SECTION 5.

Qualifications of Legislators

Each Legislator at the time of his election or appointment and throughout his term of office, shall be a resident and a qualified elector of the County of Allegany, shall be a resident and a qualified elector of the town within such district for at least one year preceding his election. In addition, not more than one such legislator shall be elected or appointed from among the residents of the same town in any district except in District 4. No legislator shall be eligible to hold at the same time any other elective County, Town or Village office.

SECTION 6.

Primary Election for Legislators

Candidates to the office of County Legislator shall be nominated at the annual primary election held in the odd numbered year before the expiration of the term of office sought, commencing with the primary election to be held in the year 1969.

SECTION 7.

Vacancies

A vacancy in the office of County Legislator shall be filled by the appointment, by a majority vote of the County Board of Legislators, of a person who possesses all of the qualifications required of members of the County Board of Legislators as set forth in Section 5 of this Local Law. The person appointed shall hold office, by virtue of such appointment, until the commencement of the political year next succeeding the first annual election at which the vacancy can be filled by election for the remainder of the unexpired term, if any.

SECTION 8.

Meetings with Town Supervisors

The County Legislators from each of the aforesaid five districts shall meet with the Town Supervisor or Town Supervisors of the town or towns within their respective District at least once every three months during each calendar year, at such time and place as they shall mutually agree upon, for the purpose of providing liaison between County and Town governments and for such other purposes as said County and Town officers may deem appropriate.

It is not intended by this Section to delegate or confer any legislative or administrative powers or duties which are or may be delegated or conferred by law on the County Board of Legislators. Any decision, recommendation or resolution by such County and Town officers shall have no legal force or effect on the County Board of Legislators or the County of Allegany.

SECTION 9.

Effect of Other Laws or Acts

Any law, general, special or local, or any ordinance, resolution or other act to the extent inconsistent herewith shall be superseded by the within law.

SECTION 10.

Separability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Local Law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such adjudication shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph or section thereof directly involved in the proceeding in which such adjudication shall have been rendered.

SECTION 11.

Approval and Effective Date

This Local Law shall be submitted to the New York State Supreme Court for its approval and, if approved, shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the County of Allegany at a special election to be held on March 4, 1969 and, if approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of said electors voting thereon, shall become effective on the date it is filed in the Office of the Secretary of State.
