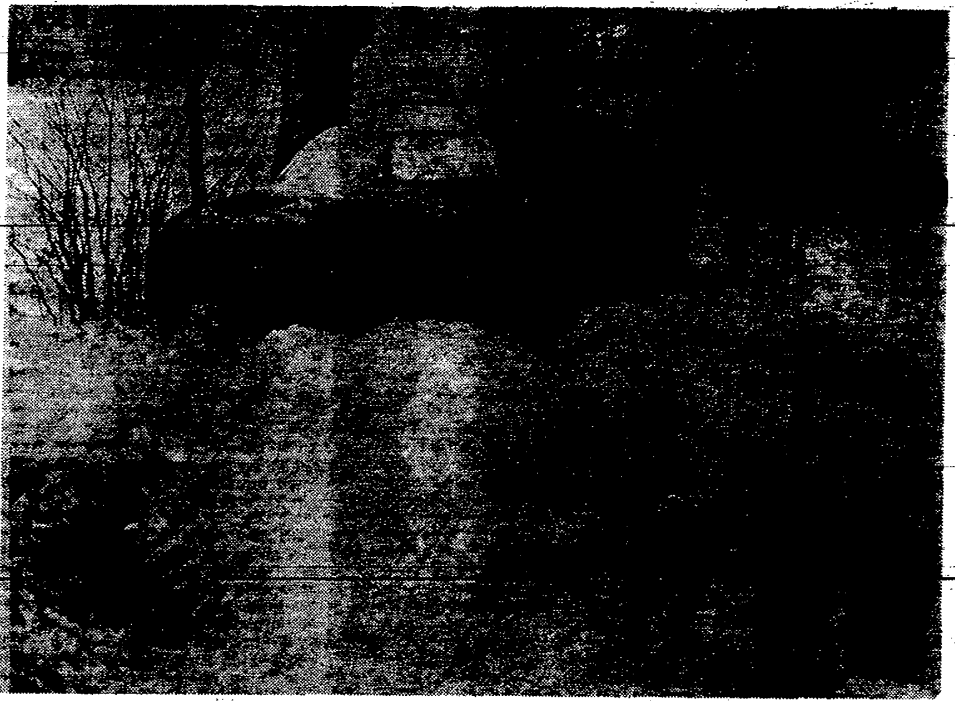
Downbeats
