Mrs. James Joyce Installed Chairman of County Red Cross Chapter

Following the minutes and the treasurer's report given by Miss Alice Filkins and Richard Scott respectively, the fund reported was presented. Total Chapter goal: \$23,396; Total cash collected to date, \$6,832; Authorized portion to be retained by the Chapter, \$4,121; National organization's portion, \$2,711; Total pledges to be received from federated campaigns, \$14,660; Total fund campaign, \$21,432; leaving the Chapter \$1,964 short of total quota.

Kenneth Dillon, 2nd Vice Chairman, explained to the board that many times it has been asked why it is necessary to send part of our quota to National Headquarters. National Headquarters does not have a fund raising campaign, its funds come entirely from the various chapters throughout the United States and Allegany County Chapter is just a part of this vast net work. "Each time we relay a birth, death, critical illness or health and welfare report, we talk to a Red Cross Field Director stationed at a military installation. The National Red Cross must pay his salary. Wherever our servicemen are throughout the world, the Red Cross is there. Over 1,110 messages a day are being relayed from Washington, D. C., to Field Directors in Vietnam. Many of these messages originate in Allegany County," he said. The National Red Cross also assumes the responsibility for all costs for assistance to victims of disaster.

Applicants For N.Y.S. Driver's License Must Take Written Tests

Applicants for New York State driver's licenses will take written tests prepared by a computer.

Motor Vehicle Commissioner Vincent L. Tofany said the new computerized examinations have been successfully field-tested in the Brooklyn and Rochester District Offices of the Department of Motor Vehicles. The new system is expected to reduce cheating on the examinations since each exam sheet will be different from all others. Only the English language examinations will be computer-printed. The Spanish tests have not been computerized.

He explained that each applicant for an operator or motorcycle license will be given a computer-printed sheet containing 20 of the 90 possible multiple-choice questions. In each case the computer selects the 20 questions at random, and also randomizes the order of the four possible answers to each question.

"This randomization provides for 24 trillion possible combinations."

Commissioner Tofany said in printing each examination sheet, the computer also prints a detachable answer key. The key by the Motor Vehicle Bureau examiner, conducting the test, has been correct answers are marked for a passing grade.

Unlike the present written tests, the new examinations will be limited to driving rules, regulations, and techniques as described in the English and Spanish editions of the State's all-new Driver's Manual. This manual, used in the examinations, are included in the New Driver's Manual.

Applicants will no longer be tested on the information in Part I of the manual. Motor Vehicle Department Rules, Regulations, and Procedures, which includes licensing and registration, procedure and suspension, vehicle inspection, and insurance. Although all motorists will still be responsible for this information, the new examination is designed to test the applicant's knowledge of driving rules and techniques.

The new manual has a reference-book organization with a detailed table of contents to enable motorists to rapidly locate needed information. It is a third larger than the former manual and contains new sections on emergency driving, vehicle condition, motorcycle operation, injury prevention, and first aid.
