Special Federal Tax Rules Apply For Parents Supported By Children

Special tax rules apply when children jointly support their father or mother, John E. Foley, District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Buffalo has announced. Even though not one of them

provided more than half of the parent's support for the year, tax laws provide that one of the children may claim the parent's exemption for tax purposes, Mr. Foley said. To do this, the child claiming the exemption must have contributed at least 10 percent of the parent's support and the other dependency requirements must have been met.

Mr. Foley said that in these circumstances, the children can decide among themselves which will claim the tax exemption. The others are then required to fill out a special form stating that they will not claim the exemption. These forms are filed with the return of the one claiming the exemption.
