A program in elementary education leading to the bachelor of arts degree will be established by Alfred University next September, University President Leland Miles has announced. The new program will complement an already existing departmental study area specializing in the preparation of secondary school teachers.

More than \$13 million in construction is scheduled this year on the campus of Alfred State College. The plans were disclosed by officials of the college during the fourth annual Community Leaders Luncheon held recently. Dr. Roger F. Rowe, vice president, told the group of about 80 persons, that has already begun on a 1,000-bed dormitory complex that has a price tag of \$7,816,000. The project consists of a series of 11 inter-connected buildings and is located to the west of a recently completed Engineering Technologies building.

It wasn't quite a 100 per cent turnout Saturday, but \$61 taxpayers out of an approximately 400 eligible voters went to the polls to cast their vote in the special referendum on the acceptance of the Combustall from the Air Preheater Company, the construction of an incinerator plant and the borrowing of \$30,000 for its construction.

The towns of Wellsville and Andover and the villages of Wellsville and Andover have signed a four-way contract for the use and upkeep of the village landfill on Snyder Road. The 15-month agreement, retroactive to March 1, will cost approximately \$1.93 per person, based on the 1960 census of the four communities. These are: village of Wellsville population, 5,967 persons; town 2,311 persons; Andover village, 1,246 and Andover town, 554 persons. The total annual cost of the operation amounts to \$19,485. The landfill includes approximately 35 acres in the Town of Andover and 40 acres in Wellsville. Russell Teller, is full-time operator.
