

School Board Hold Regular Meeting

Three Teachers Resign

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order by Mr. Carl Burdick, President. Mr. Kessler and the following Board members were present: Mr. Horan, Mr. Stephens, Mr. Godown and Mrs. Slade.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by Mr. Horan. Seconded by Mr. Godown. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler read the bills for the month of March 1969 amounting to \$14,893.59, plus utilities. Mr. Godown made the motion that these be paid. Mr. Horan seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

"Cafeteria bills in the amount of \$1,395.78 were read by Mr. Kessler. The motion to pay these was made by Mr. Stephens and seconded by Mrs. Slade. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Bills to be paid on Title I — ESBA — 1968-1969 were read by Mr. Kessler. The amount of these \$130.88. A motion to pay these was made by Mrs. Slade and seconded by Mr. Godown. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler read the bills to be paid on Title Basic — 1968-69. The amount of these was \$243.37. Mr. Godown made the motion that these be paid. Mrs. Slade seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for approval. Mr. Horan made the motion that this report be accepted as read. Mr. Stephens seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Kessler, showing a net gain of \$278.76 for the month of March. A motion was made by Mr. Godown to file this report with the minutes. Seconded by Mrs. Slade. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Gross Payrolls were read for the approval of the Board. The total was \$40,661.13. Mr. Stephens made the motion to accept these as read and Mrs. Slade seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

A motion was made to continue in the District Bread Bid for the year 1969-1970. The motion was made by Mr. Horan and seconded by Mr. Godown. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Mr. Stephens and seconded by Mr. Horan that John Hewes be reimbursed the amount paid by him for the Basketball team's dinner at Howard Johnson's Restaurant — for Section V Playoff at Fairport, New York. The amount, \$36.00. Resignation of Kathleen Plaisted accepted. Moved by Mr. Godown — seconded by Mrs. Slade. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Resignation of John Frascella accepted. Moved by Mr. Horan and seconded by Mr. Stephens. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Resignation of Sylvia Shear accepted. Moved by Mr. Stephens and seconded by Mrs. Slade. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Mrs. Marsh was appointed as English teacher in Secondary School. Moved by Mr. Godown, seconded by Mr. Stephens. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Bid for Station Wagon was opened. One bid received for \$212.00 from Robert Brandes, R. D. No. 2, Wellsville, New York. Tel. 598-5830. Moved by Mr. Horan, seconded by Mr. Godown. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Moved that Mrs. Van Stine be authorized to attend N. Y. S. Nurses Conference at Grossingers April 17-18-19. Moved by Mr. Godown, seconded by Mrs. Slade. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Moved by Mr. Stephens and seconded by Mr. Godown, authorizing the Clerk to advertise for Bids on a 66 Passenger School Bus not exceeding in cost of \$10,500.00. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Moved to adjourn the meeting at 9:34 by Mr. Horan, seconded by Mr. Godown. Carried by 5 votes of yes.
