

Scouts To Attend Ho-Ee-Ye-Seh Camporee May 2-4

Over 500 Boy Scouts and Leaders from Allegany and Cattaraugus counties are expected to attend the Seneca Council Annual Ho-Ee-Ye-Seh Woodsmen Camporee, May 2, 3, 4 at the Council Halsey Farm property according to Wilfrid Nash, Camporee Chairman.

Mr. Nash has announced that the program of events will start with a check in and set up of campfires from 4 P. M. to 8 P. M. Friday, May 2. A 10:00 P. M. Scoutmasters meeting will highlight the first night's activities.

Saturday's program will include cooking outdoors and fun events consisting of a Nature Conservation program, a special project and a special Skill-O-Rama in the afternoon. According to the Skill-O-Rama Events Chairman, Gene Garbman, of Cattaraugus "the strength of Scouting is seeing boys enjoying themselves and learning to live outdoors in Nature." Special Skill-O-Rama events will include a Fishing Contest, Indian Fire Making, Plant Identification, Rope Rescue, Log Sawing and Signaling.

A special Conservation Department Instructor Team will be on hand to demonstrate wildlife management and conservation techniques.

A special participation ribbon will be presented to each unit attending the Camporee. Other ribbons will be presented at the Saturday night Camporee to the troops that have outstanding campfires.

Mr. Nash announced that the Webelos Cub Scouts are invited to attend Saturday's program and observe the Nature Conservation program from 10:00 A. M. to 4:00 P. M.

Members of the Seneca Council Ho-Ee-Ye-Seh committee include John Robb, Campfire Chairman; John Snyder, Physical Arrangements Chairman; Laddie Parry, Camp Chief; Robert Grabowski, Program; Neil Saylor, Program and David Miller, Camp Staff.

Cub Scouts at their weekly den meetings and May pack meeting will follow the theme, Wonders of the World, Fraiser said.

Major emphasis for most Cub Scout Pack will be on the "Wonders of Nature", Fraiser explained and will include trips, collections, building bird houses and feeding stations, and also conservation projects.

Pack plans for June, July and August will be announced at the May Pack meetings with most Packs planning for major outdoor activities for the parents and boys.

The ten year old Webelos Scouts will work on requirements to earn the Naturalist Badge and will make nature exhibits for the monthly pack meeting.

Other council and district activities during May include Wolf Creek Beaver Day, May 24th and a Central District Annual Meeting on May 27th.

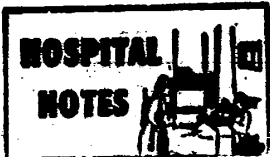
