News For Motorists

An amendment to the State Vehicle and Traffic Law, now in effect, provides for the dismissal of a vehicle lighting requirement violation summons if certain conditions are met.

A motorist who has received a summons may have it dismissed by the court if he provides proof that the defect was corrected before cusk of the next day.

The single exception is when

The single exception is when both headlights are not working properly. In this case, the carmust be removed from the high-way immediately and cannot be driven until proper repairs are made.

The charge will be dismissed in her cases if the motorist subcourt that the defect has been corrected. Such proof can be:

1. A statement from an official
New York State Inspection Sta-

ion.

2. A statement from a repair garage, signed by the person mak-

3. If the vehicle is part of a fleet, a statement of repair from the fleet maintenance supervisor.

4. A statement attesting to such repairs signed by a police officer.

Any such statement must contain the time and date of repairs and attest that all lighting equipment is in proper repair and adjustment.


