Some 103,000 chauffeurs are due to renew their New York State driver licenses by the end of May, Motor Vehicle Commissioner Vincent I. Tofany has announced.

Renewal applications have been mailed by the Department of Motor Vehicles in Albany and should be reaching the chauffeurs' residences within a few days.

The Commissioner urged those due to renew to act as quickly as possible so that the transaction can be completed by mail. Since Friday, May 30, is a holiday, drivers will have only until May 29 to get their new licenses.

Should an application not arrive by May 15, the driver should go to the nearest motor vehicle issuing office. A new one can be completed there.


