Parks And Outdoor Recreation Fees Increased

The State Conservation Department and the State Council of Parks and Outdoor Recreation have announced an increase in fees at all state operated campsites.

Camping fees at campsites under the jurisdiction of the Division of Lands and Forests and unimproved State Park areas will be increased from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per day. Fees at improved State Park areas where electrical service is provided will be raised from \$2.00 to \$2.50 per day. The daily rate for cruiser docks and tent platform sites on the state owned islands of Lake George will go from \$1.75 to \$2.50.

This is the first across the board rate increase for camping since 1964. There will be no fee increase at picnic or day use facilities during the summer season.

It was pointed out that the increases are in line with increased construction, maintenance and operation expenses.

Tree Seedlings For Sale Now!

The New York State Conservation Department announces that tree seedlings are now being offered for sale on a "cash and carry" basis at the Oak Orchard Nursery.

Species currently available in units of one thousand are: white and red pine, Norway and white spruce. These trees are surplus stock and will be sold to eligible landowners for ten dollars per thousand.

The Oak Orchard Nursery is 7 miles northwest of Oakfield on the East Shelby and Podunk Roads on the Genesee-Orleans County Line. Office hours are from 8 a. m. to 4:30 p. m., Monday through Saturday, until the surplus stock is sold. It is advisable to call the nursery before coming — Medina 798-1470.

Under state law, the trees must be used for reforestation and cannot be planted for landscaping or ornamental purposes. The trees may be cut for Christmas trees.

As long as the ground remains damp and the days mild, ideal planting conditions will exist. Why not do your part for conservation — plant that idle land to trees.
