Last week, the history classes read a special report on hunger in the United States in a student newspaper published by the New York Times. The majority of us were astounded to learn of the terrible conditions existing in this country. Hunger affects everyone; Negroes, Mexican, Americans and Whites. But the worst off of all groups are the reservation Indians.

Among Navajo children there has been a high incidence of two rarely found diseases: marasmus or calorie starvation and kwashiorkor or extreme protein deficiency. Fifteen children have died in the last five years of one of these diseases. These diseases are not even considered to be found in any other part of our nation. Most people don't even know they exist.

Other people afflicted with hunger is the Mississippi Delta Negro. The hunger of the Delta Negroes came to attention in 1967 when Senator Robert F. Kennedy and Senator Joseph Clark toured the area. Since then, food stamps have been sold to the poor thru out the country, yet some people don't even have fifty cents to purchase them. The food stamps that are bought are intended to last a month, yet people interviewed in the article all disclosed that the food ran out in the second or third week.

Robert B. Clarke, a leading advocate in Washington for the hungry poor, believes that there are probably five million "chronically hungry" Americans and five to ten million additional undernourished.

Obviously, something has to be done about this problem in our country. It seems incredible to most of us that something like this could be going on in a nation as rich as ours. But it is, and it's becoming increasingly worse every day. Something has to be done and soon - before it's too late.
