Servicemen May Obtain N.Y.S. Chauffeur License Without Road Test

A serviceman may now obtain a New York State classified chauf-feur license without taking a road test if he meets certain qualifica-

Motor Vehicle Commissioner Vincent L. Tofany says that this waiver applies to servicemen or active duty and also to former servicemen who apply within a year of discharge.

To qualify for this exemption, an applicant must present a certificate of service or discharge, and a government motor vahicle operator's identification card (Form SF-46) certifying he is qualified to drive the type of vehicle for which he wants a license. He also must pass any required

A New York State driver's license or a valid license from another state is not needed.


