Gary Rosintowski, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Rosintowski of Andover, was one of the leading actors in the stage production "Blithe Spirit", presented recently by the Carthage Little Theater in the Carthage Central Junior-Senior High School Auditorium.

Gary has been the physical education instructor at Carthage Elementary School since February 1967. He also was director of the summer playground program at the Carthage village athletic field the past two summers.

While attending Andover Central School, Gary played in "The Remarkable Incident at Carson's

Corner" and "The Boy Who Swam to England" at Brockport State University College, he was both an actor in "Cradle Song" as a referee and as the son of Al Jolson in "Billie Holiday" and the Party Theater, which the Brockport students staged for a children's theater production, "Leave It To Me" and the Frederick Duranowski play, "The Visit", later transferred from the Broadway stage to a movie starring Ingrid Bergman and Anthony Quinn.
