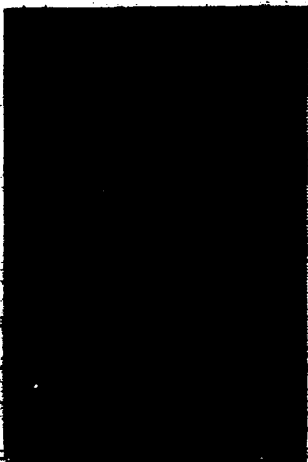

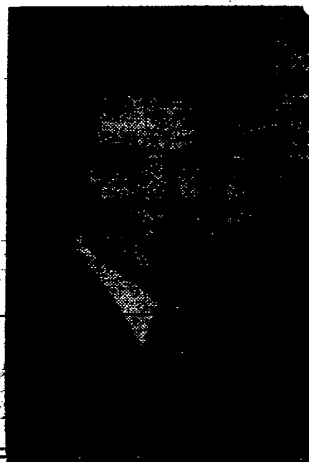

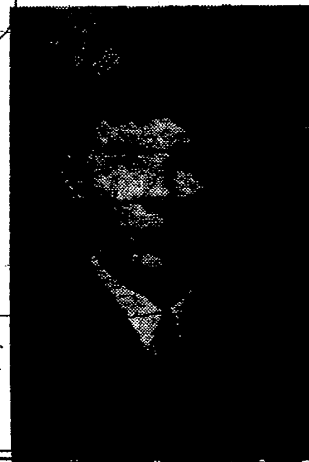

A. L. Blades & Sons Inc. Awarded Contract

Governor Rockefeller has announced the award of a contract for \$193,149.84 to A. L. Blades & Sons, Inc., of Hornell, N. Y., for resurfacing 4.3 miles of Route 408 in the Towns of Birdsall and Grove, Allegany County.

The firm submitted the lowest of six bids to the State Department of Transportation. The project will be paid for with funds from the Transportation Bond Issue approved by New York voters in 1967.

Asphalt pavement resurfacing and the stabilizing of road shoulders will extend from Fitch Hill Road northeasterly to County Road 15A.

Scheduled for completion by November 19, 1969, all work will be under the supervision of William J. Dennis, engineer in charge of the State Department of Transportation District Office at Hornell.
