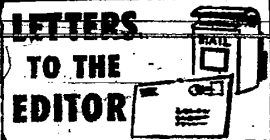


James R. McCormick

Debbie is enthusiastic about President Nixon's letter and plans on discussing the potential of the young people taking part in voluntary, part-time projects right in our own communities. Some time in the near future she plans on reporting back to the President in regards to some basic ideas in stating this project in our local area.

Debbie attends Archbishop Walsh High in Olean, New York. She is a senior this year and plans on enrolling in Orange County Community College in Middletown, New York or Erie County Technical Institute and major in Physical Education.

She is a recipient of the Manus Christi Award, outstanding Catholic Youth, Daughters Of The American Revolution Award, and the first female President elected to the Student Council in the history of Walsh High. Debbie has served as president, treasurer of her parish CYO, and Diocesan speaker, chairman and vice-president of the J.F.K. division.

She is a member of the girls basketball, swimming, track, softball and bowling team, besides being the student representative to the Catholic Charities Appeal, and Youth Division Director for the March of Dimes.

Debbie commutes 80 miles per day to school and works part-time as a waitress in Dee's Drive Inn in Yorkshire.

Following is the letter sent to Debbie by Richard Nixon:
THE WHITE HOUSE
Washington

May 21, 1969

Dear Debbie:

During the campaign, as you will remember, the Student Advisory Board was established to maintain communications with young men and women on the crucial issues of the day. I would like to continue this communication by reporting to you personally on a matter that I believe to be of major concern to us both.

More than any other in the past, your generation is actively seeking to shape society. Other generations were content to wait for responsibility; yours reaches for it eagerly.

The fact that millions of young Americans are already striving to find ways of improving our nation is enormously exhilarating. The challenge to this Administration is to find ways of helping to put your enthusiasm and your knowledge to work.

This Administration will make more use of young people than any other in the nation's history. The White House staff, for example, is the youngest — and I think the best — that has ever been assembled. We will continue to bring the finest young minds we can find into the government.

In addition, this Administration is now considering plans to help young people take part in voluntary, part-time projects right in their own communities. I believe that the potential here is tremendous; we have to find ways of exploiting it, and we are hunting for them right now. From your own past record, I am sure that you are eager to get on with the job of helping to make America a better America for all Americans.

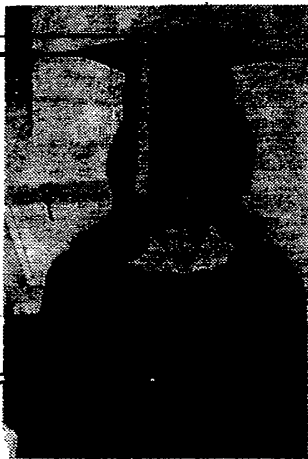
