He was also a Director of Woodlawn Cemetery Association in Canisteo; and Chaplain of Hornell Chapter of Dads of Vets of Foreign Wars and the District and State Organization of Dads.

He was survived by his widow, Mrs. Mildred Henry Burd and Nephews.
