County Clerk Announces Installation Of New Computer System

Allegany County Clerk, Helen S. Ackerman, announced today that her motor vehicle bureau is now a part of the State Department of Motor Vehicles' new computer system for issuing duplicate driver licenses.

The new system, inaugurated by Motor Vehicle Commissoner Vincent L. Tofany last year, can produce a replacement license in a matter of seconds. In the near future, the system also will be used to duplicate lost vehicle registration certificates or other mo-

"This system will be of enormous assistance to us in providing
service to the motorists of our
county", Mrs. Ackerman remarked
A device called a computer terminal, which is a special type of
remote-control typewriter, has
been installed in the County
Clerk's main office in Belmont. been installed in the Cou-Clerk's main office in Belmont.

An operator uses the keyboard to request the duplicate license, after which the computer takes over and prints the license at the rate of 14-plus characters per sec-

Under the former system, the necessary data had to be transmitted by mail to the central files in Albany. Sometimes the driver had to wait from one to two weeks for his duplicate license.

Each computer terminal is connected directly with the license files in the main computer in Albany via telephone lines. After the operator types the necessary data on the computer terminal and activates the machine, the computer in Albany "reads" the request, checks its data bank, and then transmits and prints all pertinent data on a license form.

Should that data indicate that the license is under suspension or revocation, the computer will report this instead of completing the form. Each computer terminal is con-

Should the computer fail to locate the data because the request does not conform to the information on the original license, the driver will be nearby to give the terminal operator the needed information. formation.

Mrs. Ackerman said that by the end of the year 263 terminals similar to that installed in her office will have been installed in 93 motor vehicle issuing offices throughout the State. New York is the first state in the nation to use the terminals to process motor vehicle information.
