LIVING UNDER LAW

OUR SERVICEMEN

When a young man is called to duty by Uncle Sam, his civilian plans for work, education, and social life are usually disrupted.

The State and Federal law may help him to overcome some of these disruptions in the interest of promoting national defense.

Recently, for example, the plight of Casey Jones was considered by the Court.

Casey, a young man who worked for a railroad, was called to colors just when things started to look good for him on the job. He served his country well and was discharged honorably after two years.

Casey went back to the railroad which reemployed him. But things weren't going so well for the railroad any

more. It looked as if Casey might lose his job after awhile. Had he been able to keep his seniority, he would have had a better chance. Now non-veterans were ahead of him in seniority at the railroad. Seniority affects preferences for recall, after a lay off, and other benefits.

He talked to his lawyer. They took his case to the Federal courts and claimed that the Military Service Act allowed him to keep his seniority as if he had been on the job all the time.

The court ruled Casey could keep his rights and would not have to take a step back. He got his seniority. The courts construe veterans' rights liberally.

Most public employment favors veterans. Time in service, for example, is still counted for purposes of retirement benefits. Social Security rights are also protected.
