Learn & Return Day To Be Held October 4

A Learn and Return Day will be presented by Cooperative Extension of Allegany and Cattaraugus counties on Saturday, October 4. Four leaders training lessons will be presented simultaneously at St. Bonaventure's Student Center from 10 o'clock to 12 o'clock noon.

A lesson on painted finishes will be presented by Clark Garner, Extension specialist. He will conduct a lecture-demonstration concerning paints, abrasives, brushes and other products and equipment necessary for the application of a painted finish. Emphasis will be given to preparation of the wood surface, selection of paint, the products and techniques used.

The kilos are coming, a lesson on the metric system, will be presented by Daphne Thompson, Cooperative Extension Agent. What is the metric system, why is it important, what will it mean to the United States, industry and the homemaker are the questions to be considered.

Charles Fischer, extension specialist, will present a lesson on woody ornamental plants. He will explain the types of woody plants available and their uses in home landscape planting. Soil preparation, planting time and procedure, watering, fertilizer applications, aspects of pruning, and the use of pesticides for disease and insect pests will also be covered.

Cooking for One, a program designed to fit the needs of senior citizens, will be presented by Mary Ann Maddux, Cooperative Extension Agent. Recipe ideas, shopping tips, and special dietary problems will be discussed.

Following the classes, there will be a luncheon at the Castle Restaurant. The guest speaker will be Mrs. Monica Brinson, associate professor of textile and clothing at the State University College at

Buffalo. Representatives from all interested groups in Allegany and Cattaraugus counties are invited to attend this program. This includes representatives of church groups, mothers clubs, Headstart Parent groups, and informal groups as well as homemaking groups and any interested persons.
