### Learn & Return Day To Be Held October 4

A Learn and Return Day will be presented by Cooperative Extension of Allegany and Cattaraugus counties on Saturday, October 4. Four leaders training lessons will be presented simultaneously at St. Bonaventure's Student Center from 10 o'clock to 12 o'clock noon.

A lesson on painted finishes will be presented by Clark Garner, Extension specialist. He will conduct a lecture-demonstration conduct a lecture-demonstration con-cerning paints, abrasives, brushes and other products and equipment necessary for the application of a painted finish. Emphasis will be given to preparation of the wood surface, selection of paint, the products and techniques used.

The kilos are coming, a lesson on the metric system, will be presented by Daphne Thompson, Cooperative Extension Agent. What is the metric system, why is it important, what will it mean to the United States, industry and the homemaker are the questions to be considered.

Soil preparation, planting time and procedure, watering, fertilizer applications, aspects of pruning, and the use of pesticides for disease and insect pests will also be covered.
