In the October issue of the Andover News, there appeared two articles, concerning the Election of Town, County, and State officers on November 4th. The article written by the Editor, stressed the importance on a Town basis. The article which I wrote, stressed that the important matter was the maintaining of the identity of the Town in County government and that, as the only Candidate for Legislator in the Town, I asked for your support. Thanks to those who gave me that support.

On Election Day, 570 citizens voted, and I received 403 votes. This leaves a total of 167 citizens, either on a political basis, or a personal basis, voted for a Legislator, who is a citizen of another Town. Andover loses its identity as a County Government, with a total of \$7,354,488 in the County Budget for 1970, spent largely on a Town basis, we will not be there to see how it is spent.

We are one of 16 Towns in the county which will not have "direct Citizen" representation. Our participation will be by remote control. The Town with "direct" representation, will have first choice.

During the past eight years I have enjoyed being the supervisor of Andover. I have missed two Town Board meetings, two meetings of the County Board of Supervisors, both due to summer vacations. The Town Board meetings total over a hundred, the County meetings total over 150. I have attended over 400 Committee meetings with not over a half dozen misses.

I will make a full report in the near future as to the handling of Town affairs.
