Union Announces Local Scholarship

George Westinghouse Scholarship competition for residents of Allegany County has been announced by Union College, Schenectady, N. Y.

The awards, named in memory of George Westinghouse of the class of 1886 at Union, are valued up to \$3,500 in the freshman year depending on the need of the recipients.

Union, the first college chartered by New York State, offers studies in liberal arts and engineering.

The grants are for a single year but are renewable.

In addition, the college announced two scholarship programs designed for women, who enter Union next fall.

The Capitola Davidson awards are open to all women who qualify for admission to Union while the Marian Osgood Fox scholarship program is directed toward daughters of Union College alumni who enter the first coeducational class next September.

Scholarships in each of the grant programs are valued up to \$3,500 depending upon need.
