COUNTY OF ALLEGANY A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Allegany as follows:
SECTION 1. Commencing January 1, 1970, the annual salary of the County Judge shall be the sum of Twenty-nine thousand one hundred fifty dollars (\$29,150.00)

SECTION 2. Commencing January 1, 1970, the annual salary of the Commissioner of Social Services shall be the sum of Thirteen thousand One hundred forty dollars (\$13,140.00).

SECTION 3. Commencing January 1, 1970, the annual salary of the County Superintendent of Highways shall be the sum of Eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00).

SECTION 4. Commencing January 1, 1970, the annual salary of the County Treasurer shall be the sum of Eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00).

SECTION 5. Commencing January 1, 1970, the annual salary for each Commissioner of Elections shall be One thousand seven hundred and sixty dollars (\$1,760.00).

SECTION 6. Commencing January 1, 1970, the commissioner of Elections shall be One thousand seven hundred and sixty dollars (\$1,760.00).

SECTION 6. Commencing January 1, 1970, the annual salary of the Commissioner of Jurors shall be One thousand two hundred and seventy dollars (\$1,270.00).

SECTION 7. Commencing January 1, 1970, the annual salary for each Commissioner of Civil Service shall be Six hundred and sixty dollars (\$660.00).

SECTION 8. Commencing January 1, 1970, the compensation for county corners shall be at the rate of twenty-seven dollars and fifty cents (\$27.50) perdiem in the performance of their official duties.

SECTION 9. This local law which is subject to permissive referendum shall take effect upon the date it is filed in the Office of the Secretary of State.

Gun Control Act Change Eases Ammo Record Need

It is no longer necessary for dealers to keep records of certain ammunition sales, Philip E. Kopstein, IRS Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Chief Special Investigator for New York State, has announced.

Newly enacted legislation eliminates the need for dealers to keep inates the need for dealers to keep records on sales of shotgun ammunition suitable only for use in rifles, and component parts of these types of ammunition. Purchases of ammunition interchangeable between rifles and handguns, such as .22 caliber rimfire ammunition, continue to be subject to the record keeping requirements. Previously, the Gun Control Act of 1968 required records for ail ammunition sales.

Mr. Kopstein stressed, however

Mr. Kopstein stressed, however, that no other aspect of the act, which is administered by the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division of the Internal Revenue Service, was changed by the legislation.

Persons engaged in selling ammunition still are required to be licensed under the act.

Anyone under 71 years of age

Anyone under 21 years of age cannot purchase handgun ammunition. However, individuals at least 18 can buy rifle and shotcun ammunition. Dealers must still require require purchasers to identify themselves if there is doubt about

their age.
Feions, persons under indictment for a felony, fugitives from justice, unlawful users of drugs, mental incompetents, and persons under 18 continue to be prohibited from purchasing ammunition of any type.

The change in the law affects only shotgun and rifle ammunition, and their componet parts. Dealers still are required to keen records on the sales of other ammunition, specifying the type and quantity of ammunition and identifying the buyer, Mr. Kopstein said.


