INNOCENT - UNTIL PROVEN GUILTY

at fellow's guilty if I w a guilty man."

You probably have heard someone make this remark in a private conversation when referring to a

person arrested on a criminal charge. This is, of course, the speaker's opin-ion, not particularly a proven fact. While the accused may actually be guilty as charged, this guilt must be proven in a court of law.

In America, the law presumes the accused innocent of the charges until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt. In a criminal case, the so-called burden of proof rests with the prosecution. If

the accused enters a plea of innocent and the charges are not proved as required, the man is free. He cannot be retried on the same charge again.

But the "burden of proof" may not rest entirely on the prosecution.

The law presumes all people are sane. A person charged with murder may have to take over the burden of proving that he was insane at the time of the offense, and show that he didn't have the legal capacity to commit the crime.

Civil cases differ. This proof must be on the "pre-ponderance of evidence," rather than "beyond a reasonable doubt." Generally "preponderance" is not as difficult a test as the one of reasonable doubt.
