Incentive Payments To Be Made On 1970 Wool Sales

Made On 1970 Wool Sales
Payments, will be inade beginning about the first of April on marketing of wool and mohair completed in 1970 and reported by January 31, 1971. So report George Puller, Chairman of the Alegany County Agricultural Stabilization; and Conservation (ASC) Committee, who reminded produced that the 1970 marketing year under the wool and monair programs ends December 31.

Wool payments are based on the difference between the incentive

Wool payments are based on the difference between the incentive price (72 cents per bound for shorn wool marketed in 1970) and the average price for marketings during the year. Wool and mohair sales made after December 31, 1970 will not be eligible for payment until early 1972.

Incentive payments are made through ASCS county efficient to all producers who file applications and present the necessary sales receipts and other records.

Fuller reminded producers that sales documents must show all de

Faller reminded producers that sales documents must show all details of the sale were completed during the current marketing year—including passing title to the buyer. There must also be a record showing either actual delivers or transfer of control of the vool or mohair to the, buyer. The buyer's total purchase price must be clearly stated, also.

Proof of ownership for at least 30 days is an important requirement, the ASC Committee Chairman said.

To be eligible for payments, pro-To be eligible for payments, producers must own for at least 30 days the livestock from which the wool or mohair was shorn and the unshorn lambs on which they apply for payments. Records must be presented which clearly establish compliance with the 30-day ownership requirement. ship requirement.

Requests for 1970 marketing year payments under the National Wool Act may be filed with the Allegany County ASCS Office as soon as the sales documents arrayallable, but should be filed no later than January 31, 1971, to ensure early payment.


