Assemblyman Frank Walkley Reports

Those of you who are snowmobile fans will be interested in activities in Albany regarding the new law. Several amendments have been prepared: (1.) to prohibit riding on a sled being towed by a snowmobile on a highway (2.) to limit the liability of municipalities which designate highways for snowmobile use, (3.) to provide that dealers will be entitled to two sets of demonstration plates, (4.) to make it clear that youths under ten cannot operate a snowmobile on or across highway at any time, (5.) to require financial security for those operating on roads, (6.) to clarify the provisions for operating on roads, particularly the ambiguity as to which level, county, town or village would control this.

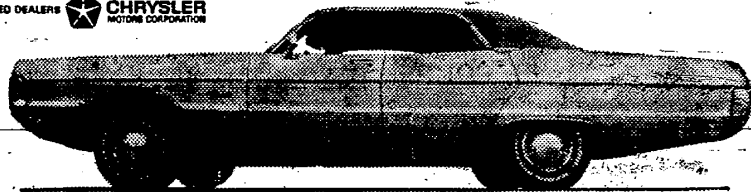
