Naval Reservists Now Must Drill

The U. S. Navy has announced that, with few exceptions, Naval Reservists who enlisted under the "two-by-six" program (two years active duty in six years of obligated service) must now attend at least 80 percent of the scheduled drills to maintain their standing in the Reserve. Formerly the requirement was that they attend 75 percent of the drills. The change applies to both air and surface units of the Naval Reserve and is designed to increase Reserve effectiveness. The change is now in effect, and individuals affected by it will be notified by mail of the new requirement. New enlistees will join

With the full understanding of the requirement to attend drills:

Under the new policy, a Reservist who misses four unexcused drills might be listed as an unauthorized absentee.

Reservists in this area who are serving under the "two-by-six" program should determine whether the new ruling applies to them by contacting the U. S. Naval Reserve Training Facility, 278 Seneca Road, North Hornell, N. Y. Telephone (607) 324-3854. LT Robert C. Gilleski, Officer in Charge of the Facility, advises that inquiries should be made between the hours of 9 a. m. and 4 p. m. any day ex-

cept Saturday and Sunday.

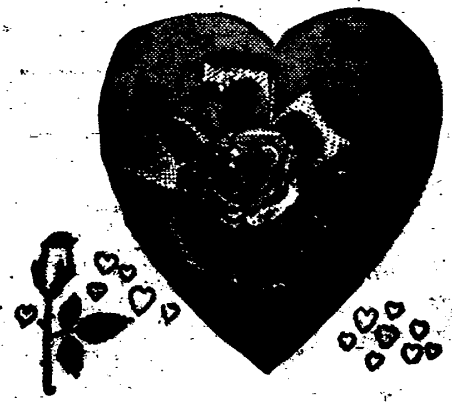
