On February 12, 1809 - near Hodgenville, Kentucky, Thomas and Nancy Lincoln's first son was born. A child who would grow to be a man looked upon as representative of America at its best, typifying the ideals of democracy.

Abraham Lincoln had very little formal education, but he became a very good lawyer. He entered politics and eventually became the sixteenth President of the United States. He became known for his patience, his ability to see both sides of an issue, his wise decisions and most of all, his humor. He could talk to people and make friends easily, but his countenance demanded respect.

On April 14, 1865 while attending a performance of "Our American Cousin", Lincoln was shot by a young actor. The following morning at 7:22 the President was dead. After lying in state in the Capital, his body was taken by a winding route to Springfield, Illinois and buried in the Oak Ridge Cemetery.

Almost from the moment of his death, his life made him a legendary figure. But the intensive research which was required to dispel the cloud of legends about Lincoln has enhanced rather than detracted from his greatness.
