Mark Bennett, a surgical patient in the Jones Memorial Hospital, returned to his home Saturday.

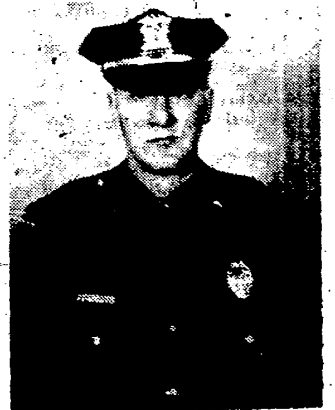
Wilbur Lehman, a medical patient in the Bethesda Hospital, returned home Monday.
