A Special Meeting of the Andover Village Board of Trustees (which is also the Village Board of Elections) was held in the Village Office Wednesday, Feb. 24th, 1971 at 6 p. m. for the purpose of examining petitions filed by the Independent Party for Village Election. All Board Members, Elmo Barden, Robert Baker, William Dunham, and Glenn Thorp, and Mayor James Mulholland, were present.

It was regularly moved, seconded, and unanimously carried to notify the three candidates that filed these petitions, that they were not found to be legally constituted under the 1970 Election Law as indicated in Article 6, Par. 135, "Form of designating petition" and also found inaccurate with the provisions of the election law in reference to committee to fill vacancies.

The Village Clerk was instructed to notify, by registered mail the results of this meeting to the petitioners.
