It was noted that James is also to receive an award from the Steuben Area Council at a still later date.

Following the presentation of awards, the Wiyaka Indian Dancers of Troop 67 of Hornell, presented a program for the entertainment of those present which was well received by both adults and the Scouts.

Announce Engagement

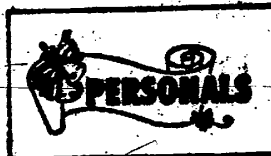

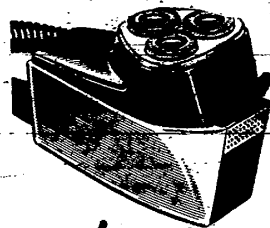
