"Jim" Kessler Wins Mayor's Slot In Landslide Vote

James K. Kessler, retiring Supervising Principal at ACS, won the Village Election for Mayor at Tuesday's contested election by a 14-1 landslide over Independent Write-In Candidate, Dave Wightman.

Incumbent Trustees Robert Baker and Glenn Thorp also easily won their bid to succeed themselves by a large plurality over challengers Richard Schrader and Ronald Glover.

In one of the largest turn-outs for a Village Election in many years that saw 372 out of the approximate 450 registered Village Voters, the following are the results of the votes polled:

Mayor — Kessler 321; Wightman 22

Trustees — Baker 290; Thorp 272; Schrader 49; and Glover 41.

In addition, on the Republican Ticket there were 10 spoiled votes; while on the Independent Ticket there were two non-valid votes for Dave; 1 non-valid sticker for Schrader; 2 non-valid votes for Glover which were erasures and write-overs; and 1 vote for Jack.
