

### School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, March 8, by Francis Horan, President. Mr. Kessler and the following Board Members were present: A. Tuttle, Wm. Walker, C. Stephens and Mrs. M. Slade.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read for approval. Motion to approve these was made by C. Stephens and seconded by A. Tuttle. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Mr. Kessler read the bills for the month of February 1971 amounting to \$11,688.51 (plus gas and electric). Dr. Walker made the motion that these be paid. Mr. Tuttle seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Cafeteria bills in the amount of \$1,243.03 were read by Mr. Kessler. Mrs. Slade made the motion that these be paid. Mr. Tuttle seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's report was read for approval. Mr. Tuttle made the motion that the report be accepted as read. Mr. Stephens seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read by Mr. Kessler, showing a net loss of \$690.32 for the month of February. A motion was made by Mrs.

Slade to pay the report with the minutes. Seconded by Mr. Tuttle. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The payroll for the month were read for approval. Mrs. Slade made the motion that the payrolls totaling \$44,300 be accepted. Mr. Walker seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Interest on Bus No. 23 on April 11, 1971, \$33.45 and on Bus No. 27 on April 14. Mrs. Slade made the motion that this be paid and Mr. Tuttle seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

**Resolution for Authorization to Jo'n Cooperative Bidding for Bread and Bread Products.** RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Andover Central School, School Dist. No. 1, participate in cooperative bidding for bread and bread products for the school year 1971-72 with other school districts in the Southern Tier of New York State, and —

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** That Louis P. Tolose, Clerk of the Board of Education Owego-Apalachin Central School, be designated to advertise, receive, and open said bids, and —

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** That the Board of Education of Andover Central School District No. 1 reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids.

Alan Tuttle made the motion to accept this and Dr. Walker seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

Conner Stephens made the motion to approve the transfer of \$2,000.00 to Federal Funds from

General funds until Title I funds are received. Alan Tuttle seconded, carried by 5 yes votes.

The Board of Education approved the paying of \$24.80; snow removal at the school. Signed claims with hours listed are on file. Mrs. Slade made the motion and Mr. Stephens seconded the motion. Carried by 5 yes votes.

The note of thanks was received from Ruth Baker for a "get-well" card sent by the School Board.

Mrs. Slade made the motion to approve the School Calendar for 1971-72. This is a County-wide schedule. Mr. Tuttle seconded. Passed by 5 yes votes.

Mr. Tuttle made the motion to approve one year's leave of absence for Mary June McNeill. Dr. Walker seconded — passed by 5 yes votes.

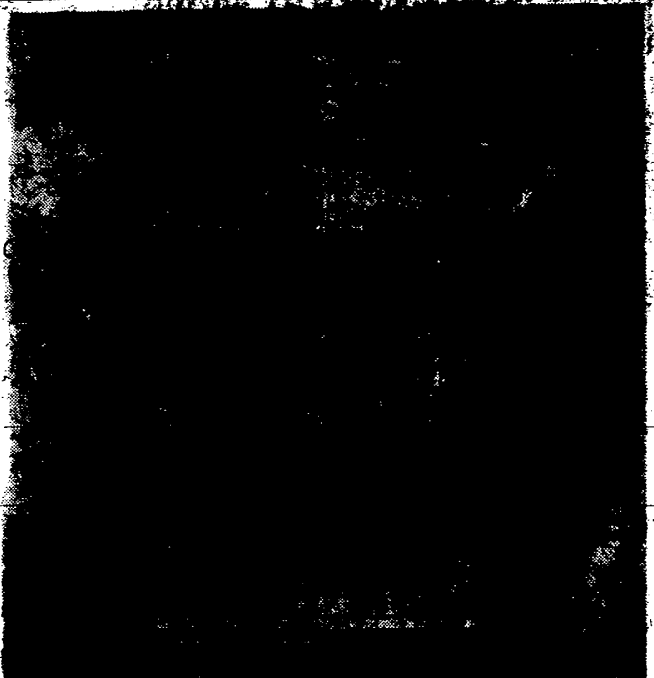

### Taber Safari Show Takes to the Woods

Wilderness life in Alaska captures the spotlight when the latest Wally Taber Safari Show comes to Wellsville Central High School Auditorium Wednesday, March 24 at 8 P. M.

Appearing on stage to narrate the double-bill of color films Taber's latest Associate, Steve Smith will relive his 10-year residence in Alaska. As a present to himself upon graduation from Illinois University in 1960, Smith journeyed to Alaska for a summer's vacation. He never came back!

"Now", Taber said, "ten years later, Smith comes back to the Lower 48 to tell of an adventuresome decade falling in love with Alaska.

"Alaska is a new country", Smith advised, "and opportunity is plentiful for the ambitious, the venturesome and the skilled." But, Smith warned, "there is little room for those without skills and ambition".

To illustrate his point about opportunity, Smith pointed to his 10-year succession of jobs: commercial fisherman, professional big-game guide, laboratory assis-

tant in the Arctic Health Center, ornithologist with the Atomic Energy Commission and biologist with the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

"Of course," Smith continued, "one can always learn new trades if he applies himself." Here, too, the field is wide open.


Again, to point up his contention, Smith cited his own case. Until 2 1/2 years ago, he had never shot a single picture with a movie camera. In the interim he not only has learned how, he has sold films to Walt Disney, National Geographic and recently contributed to the CBS spectacular, "The Wolf Men".

"By foot, boat, bush plane, dog sled, snowshoe and car," Smith related, we covered Alaska's total area to picture both the frontier life of the Alaskan and the wilderness wildlife that shares the Shangri-la with man.

The program is open to the public at popular prices and, like all Taber Safari Shows, is highly recommended for whole-family attendance.
