Area Deer Forum Held Saturday

More than 240 local and area Sportsmen crowded the Hornell Country Club Saturday for a Deer Forum that started around ten a. m. and was still in progress at 5 p. m., covering such Hot Topics as "party permits", "quotas". "deer population". "Department Administration and Planning", as well as others. well as others.

Local and area hunters from Allegany and Steuben Counties especially protested a letter sent out by State Officials to big-game hunters in City areas inviting them to come to this area to: "Fill your party permit this year with a deer from the shaded area on the map" since 'his is. "where greater harvest of does and fawns are needed"! And, as is so often the case when eloquent State Officials and ed"! And, as is so often the case when eloquent State Officials and Administrators hold an open forum, Administrators note an open forum, the ordinary Lavman or Hunter can't find a plausible or reasonable answer as the "bush is so well beaten around and down" that the original question is carefully hidden in the debris!

Sportsmen from this area street flativ hat as a result of this "invitation", Allegany and Stepher Counties were "flooded" with a swarm of "City-Hunters" that did not exhibit "Sportsman-like" conduct and left many dead does and fawns in their wake! This is one reason that they questioned the so-called "deer count" figures given by State Officials besed on an 'arbitrary formula" derived from statistics furnished by the actual number of legal deer take this past season. And, instead of promising to take the Hunter protests into consideration, it was revealed that the Commission intends to extend the commission intends to extend the commission intends to the usual three weeks instead of the usual week period.

As the Rorum progressed tawas an acute shortage of Game Protectors with no one available in Chemung County, but when it was surgested that Special Game Protectors be appointed or volunteers be solicited a State Official stated that the Union representing the employees on duty forbids this type of approach. Their reasons were that they wouldn't be able to bargain for higher wages for their State Employees if low-salaried employees or volunteers were used. I Employees if low-salaried employ-ees or volunteers were used Infact, upon direct questioning, it was admitted that the minimum standards had been raised so that an applicant for a game protectors' vacancy had to have a minimum of 2-years of College or two years prior service with the commission. In addition to this it is planned to even raise the requirements to an even raise the requirements to an plicante fo a informum of 4-years of College credit.

After the meeting was over, the After the meeting was over, the concensus of opinion of the majority of local Sportimen in attendance was that they would have to look elsewhere then the Ceneral vation Department to get any help in lowering the quota for the "party-permit" system so that the "deer herd" population would not be completely, decimated!
