

Village Board Hold Organization Meeting

At the Organization Meeting held Monday evening, April 5, 1971, at 8 p. m. the following were present: James Kessler, Mayor; Robert Baker, Elmo Barden, William Dunham and Glenn Thorp, Trustees and James F. Mulholland.

The meeting was opened by Mayor Kessler, who made the following appointments:

Robert A. Baker—Deputy Mayor
Robert A. Baker—Chairman of Electric
Elmo Barden — Chairman of Streets
Glenn Thorp — Chairman of Water
William Dunham — Chairman of Police

Robert Baker moved, seconded by Elmo Barden, that Robert Costello be appointed Supt. of Elec. utilities at a yearly salary of 7,300 and Street and Water Superintendent at 3,200. Carried.

Robert Baker moved, seconded by Elmo Barden, that Gary M. Brown be appointed Police Patrolman at a yearly salary of \$5,850. Carried.

Glenn Thorp moved, seconded by Robert Baker, that extra Police be paid an hourly rate of \$2.50. Carried.

William Dunham moved, seconded by Robert Baker, that Joan C. Dibble be appointed Clerk-Treasurer and the salary be set at \$4,400. Carried.

Elmo Barden moved, seconded by Glenn Thorp, that Barbara Walker be appointed Deputy Clerk-Treasurer at an hourly salary of \$2.00. Carried.

Robert Baker moved, seconded by William Dunham, that Reginald Sootheran be appointed Village Attorney at a yearly salary of \$500. Carried.

Glenn Thorp moved, seconded by Robert Baker, that Bessie Mulconery be appointed Village Historian at a yearly salary of \$90, plus \$5.00 for typing. Carried.

William Dunham moved, seconded by Robert Baker, that the Andover News be designated as Official Newspaper. Carried.

Elmo Barden moved, seconded by Glenn Thorp, that the Andover Office of the Citizens National Bank and Trust Co., be designated as the Official Depository. Carried.

Robert Baker moved, seconded by Glenn Thorp, that the regular monthly meeting of the Village Board be held on the 2nd Tuesday during the months of May and June and on the second Monday night of each month hereafter in the Village Office at 7:30 P. M. Carried.

Elmo Barden moved, seconded by William Dunham, that the following paid holidays be given to salaried and certain other Village employees: New Year's, Good Friday, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. Carried.

Glenn Thorp moved, seconded by Robert Baker, making the following Labor Classification, salary and added benefits:

Labor Class No. 4 — \$2.50 Per Hr. 1 week paid vacation after 1 year date of hiring; 8 paid holidays, Blue Cross and Blue Shield. Carried.

William Dunham moved, seconded by Robert Baker, that the Clerk be authorized to pay for contract charges, payrolls and invoices bearing a discount, coming due before date of audit.

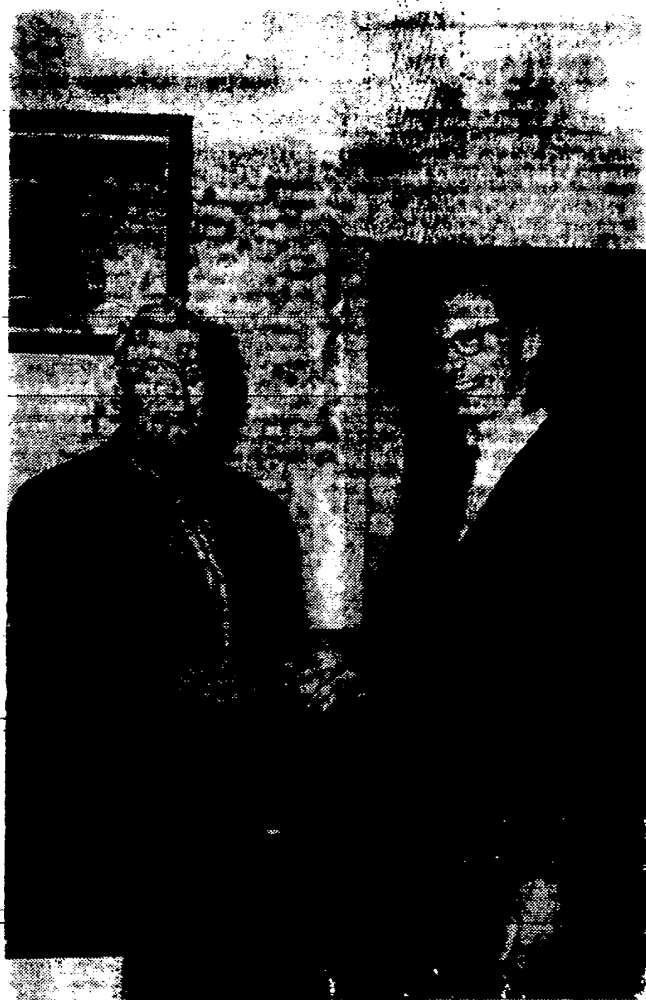
