Social Security News

Social Security beneficiaries who received some or all of their benefits for 1970 and who worked and earned over \$1680 gross in 1970 must have filed a report of these earnings with the Social Security Office by April 15 of this year, advises the Social Security Office in Olean, N. Y. Those who have not yet done so should contact the Olean office. Your Post Office has schedules of visit by social security representatives to this area.

"Last Call" To Order Forest Tree Seedlings

The Department of Environmental Conservation's Bureau of State and Private Forestry today issued a "last call" to landowners intending to order forest tree seedlings from the Department for spring planting. So far, almost 11-million seedlings of the 16-million originally on hand have been sold. The balance are going fast. With the exception of larch there is still a good supply of 10 other conifer species available for those who send in their orders now.

Landowners must order at least 1,000 trees and have at least one acre of open land available for planting. Trees are NOT for ornamental planting. Trees are sold on a first come, first served basis at a cost of \$10 per thousand. State and local sales taxes do not apply to tree seedling orders.

Upon request, a Department forester will advise the best species to plant, according to soil type, drainage, insect pests and the objectives of the property owner. Foresters can also advise landowners about the types of assistance available to help plant seedlings.

Order blanks for seedling trees are available at any Forest District Headquarters or by writing to the Division of Lands and Forests, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Albany, N. Y. 12201.

LIVING UNDER LAW

A CONTRACT
 Basically, a contract is a promise which creates a legal obligation. Many contracts are verbal or implied. Pick a candy bar from the rack of a store and you have made the offer to purchase. When the clerk smiles and says "ten cents, please," the store has accepted your offer. When you sign the contract (the consideration), the contract is complete and you own the candy bar.

Formal contracts are a different matter. Most often, they obligate you to a specific payment agreement with penalties for late payments or non-payment and may involve other elements such as the seller "cleaning up that used car."

1. Read every paper you are asked to sign.
2. Don't sign any paper which has blank spaces on it.
3. Don't rely on sales talk. If the provision you want is not in the contract, don't sign it.
4. If you can't understand the contract don't sign it until it is explained to your satisfaction.
5. If you're not satisfied, see a lawyer before you sign or not at all.

So often, a person signs a contract without reading the various provisions. It is a bad idea. Don't let the law take advantage of you. Read the contract before you sign or not at all.
