On April 23, 1971, seventeen members of the Andover National Honor Society were among the over 250 students who attended the first annual recognition dinner for Allegany County National Honor Society Members at The Castle Restaurant in Olean. After a brief introduction by Mr. Bruce Forness, Supervising Principal of Richburg Central, the President of St. Bonaventure University, Rev. Reginald Reddon, gave the invocation. Those in attendance were treated to a sumptuous dinner and following dinner an interesting but thought provoking program. During the program Mr. Deyo Montamy, Administrative Assistant for Allegany County B.O.C.E.S., presented plaques to the five highest scoring Regent Scholarship winners. Our own Danny Slade was honored with a plaque for placing second in the County with a score of 277. The advisors were given certificates to present at a later time to the forty-seven other scholarship winners in the National Honor Society.

Mr. Joseph Pollack, Principal of Beeber Junior High School in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, who had only recently returned from a tour of the British school system, was the guest speaker. He spoke of 'bringing together our segregated society' using segregated to mean not just racial, but every type of segregation known to society. He stated that today our educational institutions must be interested not only in helping us to 'earn a living,' but also to earn a creative, humane, and sensitive' outlook on life. Schools must not only teach the three R's of reading, writing and arithmetic but also of 'racism, revolution, and relevance' he declared. In conclusion, Mr. Pollack stated that 'our society needs thinking people who will forge a program for others to accept as the next step in changing and bettering our society.' 'Young people', he stated 'must have the strength, willingness, talent and time to accomplish this goal.'

Dr. Robert Luckey, Assistant to the President of Houghton College, offered the benediction saying he hoped we would build on the thoughts of consideration, love, and self respect.'

TRACK

Andover placed fourth in the first meet of the season last Wednesday. Scio won with 42 1/2 points, Fillmore 38, Cuba 34 and Andover 32 1/2.

The Panthers won three events, setting two school records and one Cuba track record. Don Sisson won the two mile run in 11:26 breaking his own A.C.S. mark. Andover's mile relay team of Ron Godown, Doug Green, Dale Clark, and Dan Slade won in 4:13.6 for an A.C.S. and Cuba track record. Dale Clark was a double winner taking the low hurdle in 26.3 record.

Don Sisson placed second in the mile with a 5:07 clocking, which may be a school record. Brian Cannon placed third in the high jump. Dan Slade placed fourth in the triple jump and Chad Grossman fourth in the mile run. In the 440 yard run Ron Godown placed third and Doug Green fourth. Dennis Herr placed fourth in the 880 yard run, Alan Green tied for third in the shot put and a second place by the 880 relay team of Dave Bucholz, Roger Godown, Randy Potter and Ed Billings rounded out the Panther scoring.

The second meet of the season was held Wednesday, April 21 at Alfred-Almond. The team results were Alfred-Almond 81, Arkport 77, Andover 39 and Belfast 6.

Andover again won three events. Don Sisson won the two mile in 11:09 setting another school mark. The mile relay team also improved their record, running a 4:10.6. Randy Potter was the third winner for A.C.S. taking the discus with a throw of 96 feet. A second place was scored by Dale Clark in the 180 low hurdles with an improved time over the last meet. Don Sisson preceded his victory in the two mile with a third place in the mile. The 880 relay team of Dave Bucholz and Billings Roger Godown and Dennis Ordiway placed third while the 440 relay team of Bucholz, Billings Dave Haueh and Dennis Herr placed fourth. For Godown placed third in the 440 fourth place were recorded by Dennis Ordiway in the 100 yard dash. Dan Slade in the triple jump and Alan Green in the shot.

If anyone has any information concerning past track records or performances, the track team would appreciate knowing about them. We would like to establish a set of school records in the track and field events and would appreciate any help we can get.
