St. Bonaventure University To Hold Press Day May 8th

Stephen Rowan, formerly with Walter Cronkite's CBS Evening News and currently anchor man on WBEN-TV's First Team News, will be a major speaker at St. Bonaventure University's Press Day on May 8.

Rowan will join some 50 professionals in conducting discussions and clinics for the more than 2,000 student journalists expected.

President Richard Nixon's Director of Communications Herbert G. Klein, will be the 10:30 a. m. keynote speaker.

Rowan has spent two decades covering news worldwide for the CBS network and for American and Canadian television stations.

For CBS News Rowan covered the Pentagon and took part in coverage of the Gemini and Apollo space programs. He was first to report the loss of the submarine Scorpion.

In Vietnam he covered the Tet offensive and was the first to report charges against Lt. William Calley in the My Lai incident.

Born and educated in Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada, Rowan began in broadcast journalism in Canada in 1948. Four years later he moved South, working for CBS affiliates in Grand Forks, North Dakota, and Little Rock, Arkansas before moving to KMOX in St. Louis. He joined CBS from there.

On Press Day, Rowan will speak on "Covering the beat from small town city hall to the Pentagon."
