Dr. Fisher Develops Self-Concept Test

Dr. John K. Fisher, associate dean of Academic Affairs, has reently developed a test of self-concept title SELF-CONCEPT AS A LEARNER (Elemenary SCAL). This is an outgrowth of a scale SELF-CONCEPT AS A LEARNER (Secondary) developed by Dr Fisher and Dr. Walter B. Waetjen, vice-president for Administration at the University of Maryland.

Both SCAL elementary and secondary scales attempt to assess four factors associated with self-image as a learner. These factors are MOTIVATION, TASK ORI-ENTATION, PROBLEM SOLVING ABILITY and CLASS MEMBER SHIP. Each factor is evaluated in terms of positive and negative statements as judged by the way an adequate learner would respond. Both SCAL elementary and sec-

pond.

Dr. Fisher has used the above scale in his research at the University of Maryland, Pennsylvania State University and Edinboro State College. The validity and reliability of the scale has not been established, but Dr. Fisher has found that it agrees rathelessely with the CALIFORNIA TEST OF PERSONALITY. closely with the CALIF TEST OF PERSONALITY.

Dr. Fisher has granted permission to educational researchers from 31 states to use the scale in their work. In addition, permission


